III. Featured Presentation: UCCI Conference Update: Trends Impacting CTE Programming, presented by Debbie Harvey, CTE Instructor, Amador Valley High School, and Chris Murphy, Social Studies Instructor, Amador Valley High School

A Powerpoint presentation was made highlighting the UCCI (University of California Curriculum Integration Institute) project attended by Debbie and Chris. This project is aimed at developing model courses that integrate academic and career-technical course content such that the resulting course has greater potential to become approved by the University of California as satisfying the a-g subject requirements. UC has established a goal of 10,000 CTE courses by 2011. The data for 2010 is:

Agriculture Education - 1,090 approved courses
Business Education 959 approved courses
Health Careers - 933 approved courses
Home Economics and Technology - 248 approved courses
Industrial and Technology Education - 628 approved courses
Art, Media and Entertainment - 3,752 approved courses
Other CTE - 779 approved courses
ROP - 1,087 approved courses
Project Lead the Way - 66 approved courses
Private Schools - 1,590 approved courses

Debbie and Chris participated in a group of instructors from various schools in California in writing a course outline and syllabus for a course entitled "Culinary World History",

which would satisfy the "a" subject requirement. The project pairs a rigorous college prep curriculum with an industry theme (CTE course). They shared details of their course outline and possible scenarios for its implementation.
